STATEMENT BY THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE FORUM FOR SECURITY CO-OPERATION ON BEHALF OF THE FSC TROIKA MEMBERS ON MODEL ANSWER FOR THE 2001 OSCE INFORMATION EXCHANGE ON SALW

In accordance with the conclusions of the Workshop on Implementation of the OSCE Document on Small Arms and Light Weapons (SALW), conducted in Vienna on 4-5 February 2002 (FSC.GAL/21/02), the Conflict Prevention Center (CPC) has prepared a Model Answer for the 2001 Information Exchange stipulated by the SALW document (FSC.GAL/39/02).

The purpose of the Model Answer is to provide a basis for those participating States that are still to submit their 2001 SALW Information Exchange returns, as well as a reference model for all participating States to compare with their 2001 submissions with a view to updating these submissions if necessary or appropriate. The full utilization of the Model Answer will facilitate reaching higher standards in the implementation of the SALW document, enhance the comparability of national submissions and lay the ground for future work of the FSC in the SALW field, especially in preparing best practice guides.

The FSC Troika would therefore like to call on those participating States which have not yet contributed to the 2001 SALW Information Exchange to do so as early as possible by making use of the Model Answer prepared by the CPC. The FSC Troika wishes to confirm that the CPC stands ready to offer any further technical assistance that participating States concerned may require in this context.

The FSC Troika would also like to encourage all participating States to give due consideration to the Model Answer in order to identify those areas in their 2001 returns that may need to be clarified, complemented or enriched according to the structure and level of detail indicated in the Model Answer.
