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Perhaps no place is better to focus antiracism efforts on than education. Racism, after all, is only as strong as its proponents and practitioners, and educating the next generations is surely one of the most effective ways to reduce the number of racists and the potential appeal of their message. However, I would like to make the following recommendations to the OSCE participating states.

- ✚ OSCE participating states' governments must continue capacity building on xenophobia related programs
- ✚ The governments must pay comprehensive attention to involve their people especially the youth in activities like debates, cultural and sport events in order to enlighten their minds and understand each other's point of view. Proper youth policies must be designed and implemented.
- ✚ The governments have to enhance objective peace-education curriculum in schools and universities by increasing knowledge and information on the threats, causes and consequences of hatred, discrimination and hate speech.

Thus, young people must be seen as part of the solution, rather than as part of the problem. At the international and regional policy level, this shift is happening and needs to keep growing in national levels, accompanied by funding, capacity building initiatives to expend young people's tools and abilities to participate in decision-making processes.
