

Some good practices... Welcoming (Hosting)

CNAI – National Immigrant Support Centres (2)

General and specific information and counselling regarding legal issues, family reunification, social protection, employment, housing and consumer advise

Public Services:

Foreign and Borders Service, Social Security, Authority for Working Conditions, Registration Services, Ministries of Education and Health

CLAII – Local Immigrant Support Centres (83)

General and specific information and counselling within a local context, mainly promoted by NGO and local authorities, alone or in association



... Labour, Employment and Training

Initiative "Portugal Welcomes"

Course of Portuguese basic (150 h), Citizenship (50 h) and Technical Portuguese (25 h) to foreigners that don't manage the national language (must be legal) women – 55,5% Institute for Employment and Professional Training

... Gender Issues

National Plan Against Domestic Violence
National Plan for Equality, Citizenship and Gender
National Action Plan Against Trafficking in Human Beings
National Action Plan to Eliminate Female Genital Mutilation



... Social Security

Protection in sickness, maternity, invalidity, old-age and death, family benefits, social pension, accidents at work and occupational diseases

Portuguese legislation applies to foreigners working and living in Portugal, if they are EU/EEA/Switzerland citizens, if covered by bilateral agreements or conventions (Brazil, Cape Verde), or simply by being a contributor

Access to the Social Action System

Protection in cash and in kind to all citizens, mainly those in socio-economic need and living in situations of exclusion



Female Immigrant Integration

- □ Female immigrants are becoming major parts of the social portuguese system, contributing to the renewal of the national population, to the economic development and to the revitalization of the cultural and social behaviours
