Declaration by EU High Representative on behalf of EU on the abolition of the death penalty in the state of Illinois, USA

The EU would like to draw the attention of the Permanent Council to the 'Declaration by the EU High Representative on behalf of the European Union on the abolition of the death penalty in the state of Illinois, USA', issued on 11 March:

"The European Union warmly welcomes the signing by Governor Patrick Quinn on 9 March 2011 of the legislation abolishing the death penalty in the State of Illinois.

The European Union congratulates the Governor and the Illinois State Legislature on this historic decision, making Illinois the 16th state in the United States to end the death penalty.

The European Union strongly hopes that this decision will encourage other US States to follow suit in joining the growing national and worldwide movement towards the abolition of the use of capital punishment.

The European Union considers that the abolition of the death penalty contributes to the enhancement of human dignity and the progressive development of human rights.
