Mr. Chairperson,

The Delegation of the Republic of Azerbaijan expresses gratitude to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Czech Republic, the Slovak OSCE Chairmanship and the Office of the Coordinator of Economic and Environmental Activities for organising and hosting Concluding Meeting of the 27th Economic and Environmental Forum. We also thank the distinguished keynote speakers Ambassador Richard Morningstar and Dr. Elena Rovenskaya for their valuable contributions.

Azerbaijan welcomes continued focus of the Slovak Chairmanship on energy co-operation and inclusion of this topic into its priorities. OSCE with its comprehensive concept of security and shared commitments in the field of energy is well positioned to serve as a platform for dialogue and co-operation on energy-related matters.
