These commitments are at the core of the comprehensive concept of security as a first responsibility of governments and as matters of immediate and legitimate concern to all participating States. In recent years we have witnessed an increase in attempts to call these commitments into question and to undermine the work in the human dimension. This mirrors a trend of democratic challenges and violations of human rights in the OSCE region.
