Thank you, Madam Director,

There was number of important human rights topics on our agenda this year and we had opportunity to discuss challenges and share best solutions. We hope that next year we will reach consensus on dates and topics of HDIM without complications and well in advance. In this spirit we look forward to a fruitful cooperation with the Slovak Chairmanship in 2019 and we would like to ensure our Slovak colleagues about our full support.

I would like to conclude by highlighting that 2018 also marks centenary of regaining independence of Poland. It is celebrated by the Polish Parliament as

Year for Rights of Women — in order to remind that the Polish women were entitled to vote already in 1918, just after the recreation of the independent state, and that equality between women and men as well as broad democratic participation of all citizens were values deeply shared by authors of the Polish independence. In this context let me underline that Poland has been and will remain a strong advocate for democracy and human rights.
