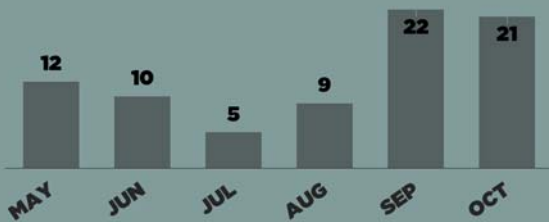

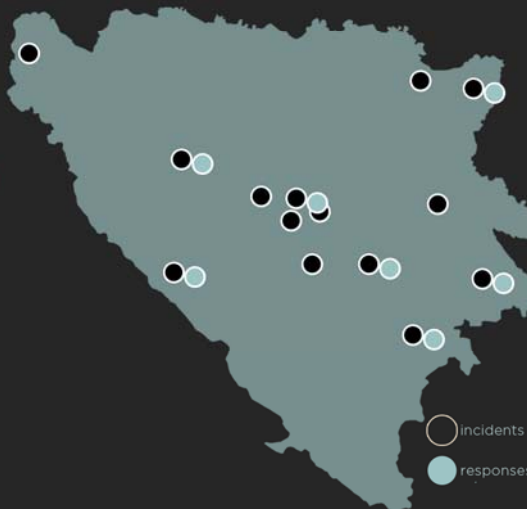

The coalition against hate Zanemari razlike launched advocacy campaign for combating hate crimes in Novo Sarajevo by organising a conference "Building tolerance and preventing bias-motivated incidents among youth on 23 October, attended by cantonal and municipal government representatives, international organizations, civil society and education institutions.
