Why regulate?

General Remarks

- Political will as the most important element
- Independence of regulator
 - Why independent regulator?
 - Independent from whom?
 - Regulation of independence (international documents)
- Elements of independence:
 - legislation; composition, appointments and functioning; financial independence, accountability, transparency, personal stamina

Licensing of Digital Terrestrial Broadcasters

• Role of the regulator

- allocate and assign frequencies on the basis of objective, transparent, nondiscriminatory, easy to understand and proportionate criteria

AVMS Directive

Technological neutrality

- Directive covers all AVM services, regardless of technology used
- Same criteria for all AVMS providers

AVMS Directive - continued

Two-tier regulation

- AVM services include LINEAR and NON-LINEAR services
- Regulation is extended to on-demand services (VoD) in order to ensure same rules for all AVM services, considering the ever growing size and influence of VoD, which, both content-wise and in a commercial sense, are competitor to traditional TV broadcasting
- Directive prescribes only a basic tier of regulation for VoD, since viewers have bigger control over service choices and time of reception

AVM service is:

- Service that has an audiovisual character
- Service with economic/commercial activity
- Provided via electronic communications network
- Service that has the characteristics of mass-media
- Service whose principal purpose is provision of audiovisual programs
- "TV-like"
- Under editorial responsibilty of its provider

In Bosnia and Herzegovina

- AVMS provider = TV station + VoD provider
- ALL TV stations must have appropriate licence for TV broadcasting, regardless of modes of transmission
- ALL VoD providers must have approval for such services regardless of modes of transmission
- Licences and approvals carry certain rights and responsibilities, first and foremost due to protection of users

Regulation of Internet content

• Only AVM services which require licence or approval are regulated

- CRA does not regulate other content on Internet, such as:
- > content of informational portals, electronic publications except if AVM service
- electronic versions of newspapers and magazines
- private users pages, bloggs, Facebook...

Recap on DTT in BiH

- Early preparatory work preparation of Strategy from 2005 2007, adoption in 2009, planned switch-over date 01.12.2011.
- Strategy not implemented, activities delayed
- Technical data:
 - ✓ DVB-T standard with MPEG-4 compression system
 - ✓ criteria and the procedure for selecting the multiplex operators are being prepared
 - ✓ no official decision on how to employ digital dividend, planned to use it for telecom (mobile) services
 - ✓ no strategy for pay TV platforms yet

Recap on DTT in BiH

- Action plan not adopted
- Strategy changed new switch-over date 01.12.2014
- 2010, CRA decision MUX A for PBS's; decision renewed anually, last time in 2015, no implementation
- Several tender procedures for digitalization of three cities for PBS's failed
- 2011 Council of Ministers of BiH adopted the decision related to financing of digitalisation via Programme of multiannual capital investments for the period from 2011 2014, in the amount of ca. EUR 18.5 mil.

Recap on DTT in BiH

- Non-adotion of Action Plan lead to almost complete blocking of the entire process
- Paralysis of public campaign process
- Usage of frequences in other RF spectrums for introduction of IV generation of mobile telephony?
- Continued technical interferences

Activities of the Agency

- Permanent contacts with the Ministry of Traffic and Communications
- Permanent contacts with PBSs
- November 2014 round table discussion (proposal, main change DVBT2, MUX A also for commercial brodcasters)
- Increased public warnings about the consequences of missing the deadline

Present

- Several international interferences recorded, actions taken
- No allocation of new analogue frequencies

Present

- PBS equipment is to be installed shortly for conecting three main cities; after that it is expected to have the second stage of purchase approved
- Still no real actions taken, no solution yet for commercial broadcasters
- If the DVBT2 proposal is adopted, an option is to migrate commercial broadcasters to MUX A which might partly alleviate the problem
