Yes, the Slovak Republic ratified the Convention in February 1999. The Convention fully entered into force in August 1999. All the APM stocks had been destroyed in the spirit of the Convention by 2000.

The Criminal Code of the Slovak Republic has been amended by Law No. 403/2004 which has explicitly introduced the notion of "antipersonnel mines" into the legislation of the Slovak Republic. (Note: Antipersonnel mines had been implicitly embraced in category of illegal possession of arms before this amendment was adopted.) Their development, production, import, export, transfer, transport, procurement, possession, stockpiling or uses are subject to sanctions under the Criminal Code.

9. Does your country have any specific measures in place to provide assistance to victims?

No, the Slovak Republic is not mine - affected country.

Instrument of ratification was signed by the President of Slovak Republic on February 28, 2006. Slovakia notified her consent to be bound by it in accordance with article 4 (3) or (4) of the Convention. A letter signed by the representative of the Slovak Republic which expressed consent to be bound by Protocol V was addressed to the Secretary-General on March 23, 2006.

The legislation of the Slovak Republic was amended by Law No. 584/2006 which has introduced Protocol V as a legally binding instrument as of November 12, 2006.

In the Slovak Republic the main body responsible for the preparation of mine clearance personell and EOD operations is the National Centre for EOD and NBC. The National Centre provides annually a set of courses especially in the following areas: 12 weeks course of pyrotechnics for members of the Armed Forces; 5 weeks course for EOD specialists for removal of improvised explosive devices. Moreover, every quarter of the year there is a 2 days professional course within the framework of interdepartmental cooperation with the Police of the SR in the field of safety restoration tests on fired or unexploded ordnance, coming from period II. World War II organized by the National EOD and NBC Centre.

### INTERNATIONAL TECHNICAL INFORMATION EXCHANGE:

In the evaluated period, a total of 1 activity was carried out in the area of international cooperation and assistance, in which three members of EOD and NBC National Centre participated in the 12-day international exercise of EOD units in the Czech Republic. The aim of this training was to exchange experience from the operation of foreign EOD units in international crisis management operations.

### INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION ON MINE CLEARANCE:

In support of the Global Coalition against the ISIL, the Slovak Republic participated in the training activities of NATO's previous activity in Iraq and is interested in cooperating with other NATO member states to continue these activities to stabilize the security situation in Iraq. At the end of October 2018, the current mandate of the National Council of the Slovak Republic for OS SR operation in Iraq ended. The actions of the Slovak Armed Forces in Iraq were perceived very positively, especially in the field of mine clearance.

As part of the NATO Defense Capacity Building (DCB) initiative, we have prepared two projects reimbursed through the Iraq Trust Fund. One in the area of mine clearance training, and in cooperation with Poland, a second project to repair and maintain the former Soviet military equipment. The first project concerning the mine clearance training was funded by the Iraq Trust Fund in amount of € 1,038,000. Slovakia has contributed to the NATO's Iraqi DCB Trust Fund to the mine clearance project 15.000 Euro in 2018.

### OTHER RELEVANT MATTERS:

At the NATO summit in Warsaw, Slovakia took over the role of leading country in the Ukraine Trust Fund for Explosive Ordnance and Counter - Improvised Explosive Devices measures (EOD / C-IED).

In this context the Slovak Republic contributes with one expert from the Ministry of Defence of the Slovak Republic in Ukraine. The expert support is provided within the activity of the International Crisis Management for the destruction of the EOD since the 16th of September 2017 in NATO Liasson Office in Kyjev as the Voluntary National Contributor.

Following the completion of the legislative process and the provision of funds, the implementation of the entire Trust Fund project can begin according to an agreed timetable from 15 January 2019. The implementation phase of the Trust Fund project focuses on 3 activities over a period of 2 years with a planned financial volume of EUR 610,000:

- a) DOCTRINES (development and creation of a common terminology lexicon in EOD and C-IED; publication of a modified Ukrainian C-IED doctrine and identification of future competency requirements);
- (b) INTEROPERABILITY (the project envisages the implementation of C-IED training activities to improve co-operation and co-ordination between individual Ukrainian armed forces involved in humanitarian mine clearance, EOD, C-IED);
- (c) CIVILIAN SUPPORT (training of members of the Ukrainian security forces in the fight against IEDs and mine awareness in built-up and urban areas).

To date, the following countries have contributed financially to the Trust Fund project: the Netherlands, Slovakia, Denmark, Luxembourg, the USA, Norway, Montenegro, Romania, Sweden, the United Kingdom, and the in-kind contribution form has been declared by Spain.

the end of October 2018, the current mandate of the National Council of the Slovak Republic for OS SR operation in Iraq ended. The actions of Iraq and is interested in cooperating with other NATO member states to continue these activities to stabilize the security situation in Iraq. At In support of the Global Coalition against the ISIL, the Slovak Republic participated in the training activities of NATO's previous activity in the Slovak Armed Forces in Iraq were perceived very positively, especially in the field of mine clearance.

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At the NATO summit in Warsaw, Slovakia took over the role of leading country in the Ukraine Trust Fund for Explosive Ordnance and Counter - Improvised Explosive Devices measures (EOD / C-IED).

Following the completion of the legislative process and the provision of funds, the implementation of the entire Trust Fund project can begin according to an agreed timetable from 15 January 2019. The implementation phase of the Trust Fund project focuses on 3 activities over a period of 2 years with a planned financial volume of EUR 610,000;


a) DOCTRINES (development and creation of a common terminology lexicon in EOD and C-IED; publication of a modified Ukrainian C-IED doctrine and identification of future competency requirements);

(b) INTEROPERABILITY (the project envisages the implementation of C-IED training activities to improve co-operation and co-ordination between individual Ukrainian armed forces involved in humanitarian mine clearance, EOD, C-IED);

(c) CIVILIAN SUPPORT (training of members of the Ukrainian security forces in the fight against IEDs and mine awareness in built-up and urban areas).
