The confidentiality of investigations versus the right of the public to know was the theme of discussion in the one-hour live talk show aired on 14th September 2015 on the First Channel of Radio Television Montenegro (RTCG). This was the second on the series of twenty shows named "Reaching the Trust Together", which is supported by the OSCE Mission to Montenegro.

The main aim of the talk shows is to serve as a platform for dialogue and to engage of various segments of society in Montenegro which will serve in the enhancement of confidence, trust, and cooperation between the public, institutions, media, and civil society.

Moderated by Andrijana Kadija, participants in the debate included Miloš Šoškić, Deputy Basic State Prosecutor in Podgorica, Saša Rakočević, Head of the Department for Combating General Crime, Police Directorate, and Jasmina Muminović, Editor/ Journalist, Dnevne novine.

During the programme, the participants discussed the methods and tools that rule of law agencies use in informing the public, the relationship between these state institutions and media, and the application of journalism ethics and media standards when reporting on criminal proceedings.

Tea Gorjanc Prelevic, Executive Director of the Human Rights Action and Aleksandar Zekovic, member of the Council for the Civil Control of the Work of Police also provided their contribution and comments regarding presumption of innocence, as the most often violated right when reporting about criminal cases. Boris Grubišić, spokesperson of the Bosnia-Hercegovina Prosecutor's office additionally presented the experience of his institution.
