RIGHTS OF MIGRANTS

The Sea Jay Foundation recommends that the OSCE participating states reexamine their multicultural assumptions. Several decades of experience should provide enough data from which to make a sound and realistic judgment.

The rights of migrants must be subordinate to the rights of the citizens of the host countries. Elites have been guided by a wishful thinking vision of the multicultural society. Millions of aliens have been introduced to erase national identity and culture. From this is supposed to emerge a synthesis of north and south, a strong, peaceful, prosperous, and tolerant society. But what if the aliens don't share this vision? What if they settle in hostile enclaves, make outrageous demands, commit violence and arrogantly expect the hosts to subordinate to their own culture? What if the situation evolves towards civil war rather than peace, strength and prosperity?

Apparently, the path chosen has been denial! Reports of growing dissatisfaction and violence are suppressed¹ Victims that speak out are prosecuted for "hate, intolerance and discrimination". Yet It is the attacks themselves that cause this "hate, intolerance and discrimination", not the victims talking about it. It's time to face up to this multicultural failure. It's time for the participating states in the OSCE Region to fulfill their basic responsibility to protect their citizens, not prosecute them for having a survival instinct.
