The Peer-2-Peer (P2P) initiative challenges teams of students from around the world to identify, develop and pitch a digital or social initiative, product, or tool to educate and empower their peers to challenge violent extremism. Since the spring 2015 pilot, P2P teams have created over 120 unique counter-narrative campaigns. By the end of the fall 2016 term, over 5,500 students from 60 countries will have participated in the programme.

In the spirit of the OSCE Ministerial Council Declaration No. 4/15 on Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism and Radicalization that Lead to Terrorism, and as part of the OSCE “United in Countering Violent Extremism” campaign, this event will bring the three best teams from across the OSCE region to the Hamburg Ministerial Council to pitch their creative concepts live in front of a jury, delegates, and the media.
