



The Sava River Initiative Launch of the Initiative: June 2001 Signing the Letter of Intent on cooperation in the SRB: November 29, 2001 Signing the FASRB: Kranjska Gora (Slovenia), December 3, 2002 Establishment of the Interim Sava Commission: Brussels (Belgium), March 12, 2003 Ratification of the FASRB: December 29, 2004 Establishment of the Sava Commission: Zagreb (Croatia), June 27-29, 2005 Establishment of the ISRBC Secretariat: Zagreb, January 9, 2006





- □ The first multilateral agreement in the region signed after the Dayton Peace Agreement (1995)
- Regulates Transboundary Cooperation in the Sava River Basin
- □ Signed in December 2002, entered into force in December 2004
- Parties: Bosnia & Herzegovina, Croatia, Serbia, Slovenia (Montenegro to express the interest)
- Implemented by the Sava Commission, with the Secretariat as its executive and administrative body

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FASRB



General objective:

Transboundary cooperation for sustainable development of the region

- Issues of sustainability (Improvement of water quality, Protection of aquatic ecosystem)
- Development activities
 (All kinds of water use, Protection against the harmful effects of water)
- Particular objectives:
 - To establish an international regime of navigation
 - To establish a sustainable water management
 - To prevent / limit hazards (floods, droughts, ice, accidents) and eliminate / reduce the consequences

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ISRBC



- □ Established for implementation of the FASRB
- □ Given the international **legal capacity**, for:
 - Making decisions in the field of Navigation
 - Providing recommendations on all other issues (i.e. Water Management)
- Composed of 8 representatives of the Parties (Member and Deputy Member) nominated by the governments
- Chaired by:
 - Mr. Kemal Karkin (B&H), the Chairman, or
 - Mr. Branko Bačić (HR), the Vice-Chairman
- Financed through regular annual contributions of the Parties from their budgets

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
ISRBC Secretariat




- □ Executive and administrative body of the ISRBC
- □ Established in January 2006, seated in Zagreb (Croatia)
- □ Composed of **8 experts** of the Parties, covering:
 - Navigation
 - Integrated RBM and Water Planning
 - Protection of Water and Aquatic Ecosystem
 - Legal and General Affairs
 - Economic and Financial Affairs

Water Management

- □ Development of the Sava RBM Plan in accord. with the EU WFD
 - Initial activities performed
 - RBM Plan Structure and Road Map produced
 - Sava River Basin Analysis planned to be performed during 2007
- □ Establishment of Integrated Systems for the SRB
 - Flood Forecasting and Warning System
 - Accident Prevention and Control System
 - Initial activities performed

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Regular activities

Water Management

- □ Preparation and realization of development programs / projects
 - Flood risk assessment study for the Sava river basin
 - Development and upgrade of hydro-meteorological information and forecasting system for the Sava river basin
 - Improvement of the monitoring system of water quality and quantity parameters for the Sava river basin
 - Establishment of the early warning system for flood protection and the accident risk assessment study for the Sava river basin

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Regular activities



Navigation

- Creation of documents:
 - to improve navigation safety (e.g. Navigation Rules on the Sava River, Rules for Waterway Marking on the Sava River, etc.)
 - to promote development and improve maintenance of the waterway infrastructure (e.g. Detailed Parameters for Waterway Classification on the Sava River)
- □ **Harmonization** with the EU regulation:
 - Rules for mutual recognition of boatmasters' certificates (CCNR)
 - Technical standards and requirements for inland waterway vessels (DC)

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Regular activities

Navigation

- □ Preparation and realization of development programs / projects
 - Study on the waterway traffic on the Sava River
 - Pre-feasibility Study
 - Feasibility Study and Project Documentation (Detailed Design, Plan for Rehabilitation and Development of Trade and Navigation on the Sava River)
 - Project Preparation and Management: Secretariat of the ISRBC
- □ A high **priority** for the future work
 - Prevention of the pollution caused by navigation (establishment of the system for collection of waste from vessels)
 - So far: Involvement in the development of such systems on the Danube and Rhine Rivers

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Regular activities



Other Accompanying Issues

- □ Creation of **Protocols**, on:
 - Transboundary Impacts
 - Emergency Situations
 - Protection against Floods
 - Prevention of water pollution caused by navigation
 - Exploitation of stone, sand, gravel and clay

Other Accompanying Issues

- □ Information Management
 - Information System (GIS)
 - River Information Service (RIS), incl. Electronic Navigation Charts (ENC)
 - On-going activities:
 - · GIS needs and capability assessment
 - Position Paper on GIS and RIS Integration
- □ Public Participation
 - Further development of the draft Public Particip. Strategy (by PEG RBM)
 - Preparation of the Methodology for monitoring implement. of the FASRB
 - Organization of the Sava Day

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Regular activities

Other Accompanying Issues

- □ Cooperation, with:
 - River navigation commissions (Danube, Rhine, Mosel)
 - River protection commissions (Danube, Rhine, Elbe, Oder)
 - UN bodies (UNECE, UNESCO, UNDP, ...)
 - Regional organizations (OSCE, Stability Pact for the SEE, SEETO)
 - Specialized agencies, associations and groups (WMO, GIS Forum Danube, PIANC Int'l Navigation Association)
 - International financial institutions (World Bank, EBRD, USAID)
 - Processes / Initiatives (Petersberg Phase II / Athens Declaration Process, Med EU WI/WFD Joint Process, Adriatic Initiative)
 - National organizations / institutions
 - NGOs and other stakeholders

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Summary of the approach

Key features:

- □ **Cohesive** (promoting cooperation of the countries after conflict)
- □ Integrated (whole basin, sustainability, development)
- □ **Transparent** (public participation)
- □ Aligned with EU directives (WFD, Floods Directive,...)
- □ Subregional (complementary to the regional one)
- Pragmatic and practical (offering, to the Sava countries, "products" such as joint plans, development programs, protocols, harmonized regulation, integrated systems)

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Summary of the approach



Challenges/possible obstacles to implementation:

- □ **Differences** between the countries
 - Level of economic development
 - Status (SLO EU Member State, HR accessing country, ...)
 - Eligibility for approaching funds
- Financing
 - Priority projects
 - Establishment of the integrated systems
- Conflict management in MWM
