Malta has not adopted any legislation that addresses the humanitarian objectives of the Convention. Malta's legal framework is in place with regard to the prohibition of the use, production, storage, transfer and destruction of anti-personnel landmines through the National Interest Enabling Powers Act, (Chap. 365) and the Military Equipment (Export Control) Regulations. No moratorium was introduced.

10. Does your country require assistance in mine clearance, stockpile destruction, mine awareness and/or victim assistance? If so, please describe.

Malta does not produce, use, stock or transfer anti-personnel landmines. There are no known mined areas within Maltese territory and no such assistance is required.

Due to the small size of the force, the Armed Forces of Malta are limited in their ability to provide assistance. This position is renewed annually.
