	The 2003 OSCE Action Plan on Roma and Sinti is built on the central goal of combating racism and discrimination against them and recommends participating States, and OSCE institutions and structures to implement on a wide scale of measures in this regard. The three sub-sequent Ministerial Council Decisions on Roma and Sinti emphasize the principle of eradicating racism against Roma and ensuring they are able to play an equal part in their societies, free of discrimination.
	The webinar will provide a forum to raise awareness among OSCE participating States about the on-going state of racism and discrimination, and continuing challenges faced by Roma and Sinti, as well to discuss actions to be undertaken by participating States and other stakeholders in view of increasing the effectiveness of efforts and measures to combating racism against Roma and Sinti.
