GRETA's observations

- Scope of the definition (broad definition versus definition strictly following the international provisions);
- Consent (irrelevance of consent not precisely mentioned in national provisions);
- Differing wording used to define the THB purposes in comparison with the international provisions



"The following shall constitute the offence of human trafficking: the fact of recruiting, transporting, transferring, harbouring, receiving a person, and of handing over or transferring control over the said person:

- 1° for the purpose of the exploitation of prostitution or of other forms of sexual exploitation;
- 2° for the purpose of the exploitation of begging;
- 3° for the purpose of labour or services, in conditions that are contrary to human dignity;
- 4° for the purpose of the removal of organs in violation of the Act of 13 June 1986 ...
- 5° or to have this person commit a crime or an offence, against his will.
- Except in the case specified under 5, the consent of the exploited person to the intended exploitation or actual exploitation is irrelevant.
- + aggravating circumstances (means): coercion, abuse of vulnerability, minority, ...



Figures – aggravating circumstances/means determined by the court (2010/2011) – based on a sample of conviction reports (decision summaries)
