Statement by Azerbaijan, Georgia and Moldova in response to the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Ukraine H.E. Mr Arseniy Yatsenyuk

Mr Chairman,

GUAM Member States – Azerbaijan, Georgia and Moldova – warmly welcome the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Ukraine H.E. Mr. Arseniy Yatsenyuk to the OSCE Permanent Council and thank him for offering the Ukrainian perspective of the work of the OSCE. Ukraine is our important regional partner, a good neighbour and a reliable friend. Our special partnership has been a driving force behind strengthening bilateral and multilateral cooperation in all spheres. We are committed to maintaining mutually beneficial long-term relations.

Our countries share the Minister's vision of the role of our Organization in addressing the most pressing challenges to security across the region. Conflict prevention and resolution lay at the heart of OSCE's collective effort.

We greatly value Ukraine's contribution to the promotion of peaceful settlement of the "frozen conflicts" in the GUAM and the OSCE area based on the recognized norms and principles of the international law.
