



- Residual Fuel Oil Cargo






















New Energy Projects – pros and cons: Needed more transparency

Institutional and expert support in revision of many important Black Sea regional documents, incl. Convention, LBS Protocol and Black Sea SAP.

The specific reasons for the revision of the BSC legal and policy documents include: a need to introduce and incorporate new conceptual approaches and notions of environmental law, to take into consideration developments at the international level, a need to re-examine the environmental priorities in the Black Sea region and to make more clear and precise the respective obligations and rights of the Contracting Parties, due to problems encountered by countries in implementing the existing documents before.

Institutional support needed



- → To ensure that regional initiatives are sustained and institutions like BSC are strong enough to promote cooperation, to stimulate good political will and therefore to increase the security in the Black Sea region through achieving harmony/balance between human/economic interest and environmental protection;
 - The BSC needs strong political support from outside and full commitment inside Black Sea region to sustain the created network and to continue working in enhancing cooperation;
- → To endorse transfer of experience from other regions and fuel dedicated involvement of the private sector in enhancing cooperation, capacity building, training and environmental protection;
- EU, OSCE, WB and similar organization should ensure that their well-meant strategies and efforts are having a solid Black Sea regional partner who is already responsible for addressing regional capabilities;
- Avoiding duplication, repetition or overlaps amongst the international organizations in the Black Sea Region.
