Title: Presentation of the RCC Strategy and Work Programme 2011-2013, with emphasis on Justice and Home Affairs

The 2011-2013 Strategy and Work Programme of the Regional Cooperation Council (RCC) was adopted in June 2010 and endorsed by the Heads of State and Government of the South-East European Cooperation Process (SEECP). The document had been designed to respond to the needs of the region and add value to cooperation in South East Europe in the areas of joint interest, namely in economic and social development, infrastructure and energy, justice and home affairs, security cooperation, building human capital, and parliamentary cooperation. The strategy was prepared in close cooperation with the European Commission and other 45 RCC members.

Over the last 2 ½ years, significant progress has been made in regional cooperation in the area of justice and home affairs; however, further upgrade is needed and expected. The RCC is currently engaged in the development of a joint strategy – platform for development of justice and home affairs cooperation in South Eastern Europe. The purpose of this event is to present these documents and trends envisaged over the next 3 years as well as to receive feedback of a wider public for the implementation.
