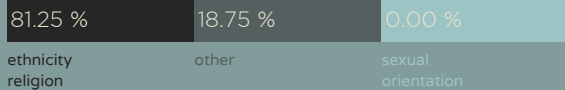

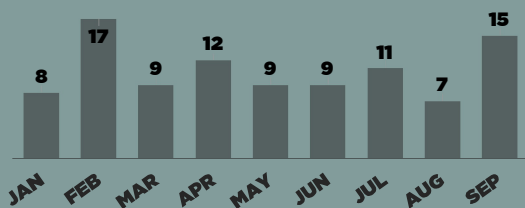

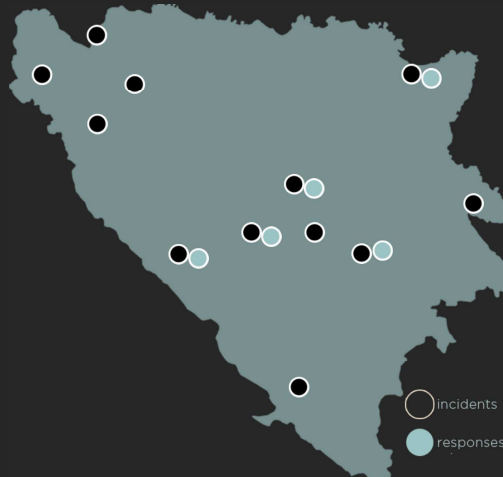

### Highlighted

In Novo Sarajevo, the Coalition against Hate (CaH) Zanimari razlike condemned the distribution of Ustaša pamphlets in Sarajevo and called on the police to investigate this incident. In Livno, CaH Uvažavanje condemned the vandalism of a local cemetery and the destruction of a memorial in a returnee village. The CaH invited all competent institutions to find the perpetrators and to prosecute them.
