


Municipal Community Safety Councils


The OSCE Mission in Kosovo supports institutions mandated to address communities' security concerns. To assist in this effort, the OSCE regularly monitors the performance of Municipal Community Safety Councils (MCSCs). The information sheet aims to provide the relevant institutions with indicators that can assist in identifying gaps and improving compliance.

The MCSCs are established based on the Ministry of Internal Affairs Administrative Instruction No. 27/2012 and the Ministry of Local Government Administrative Instruction No. 03/2012. MCSCs are created to improve communities' safety and security and aim to include a broad, gender-balanced, inclusive membership of all ethnic and religious communities in the municipality who play a role in the communities' well-being. To date, MCSCs are established in 34 municipalities in Kosovo.


Representation of women and men in the MCSCs

Number of MCSCs lacking community representation




* Kosovo Albanian community is referred in context to those in a minority situation at municipal level.

Performance and Functioning 2021


Number of meetings held in 2021

Six meetings annually are required by Administrative Instruction 27/2012 and 03/2012




■ January - December 2021 ■ January - December 2020
