Oceania	55






- Relatively recent immigration country



### **Creating solutions**





- New Citizenship Law (2006)
  - Approved by parlament with great consensus
  - Under the competence of the Ministry of Justice
  - Enlarging the right to aquire Portuguese Citizenship
- New Immigration Law (2007)
  - Approved after large public consultation
  - Simplifying procedures and norms
  - Favouring legal migration and combating illegal migration
  - Favouring family reunion



# Plan for the Integration of Immigrants



- Holistic / Global approach
- 122 measures
- 13 Ministries
- 2007/2009
- State / Civil society





- The integration and **cooperation of different public services** (services from 6 different ministries)
- new services that intend to answer to concrete immigrants needs and were not, until than, offered to immigrants
- participation of Socio-cultural mediators (cultural and linguistic proximity)







- 69 Local Information Centres to Immigrants
- 23 Units for Insertion into Professional Life
- in partnership withImmigrant Associations,NGO's and Municipalities



- This mainstream programme aims to support the social inclusion of children and youngsters from the most socio-economically disadvantaged contexts, mainly descendents of immigrants and ethnic minorities
- It is a **bottom-up approach** that funds, supports and evaluates 121 local projects (40.000 participants)
- 4 areas of activities:
  - Educational inclusion and non-formal education
  - Professional training and employability
  - Civic and community participation
  - Digital inclusion





- Short training activities in any part of the country
- Disposable to any institution (private or public) for free
- Covering several thematic areas, such as:
  - Services for welcoming and integrating Immigrants;
  - Myths and Facts on Immigration;
  - Nationality
  - Immigration Law
  - Intercultural Education
