 - Convention concerning International Carriage by Rail (COTIF) of 9 May 1980 in the version of the Protocol of Vilnius 1999
 - 7 Appendices (CIV, CIM, RID, CUV, CUI, APTU, ATMF)



OTIF'S main tasks

Systems of uniform law for

Contracts (private law) of

- carriage by rail
- use of wagons
- use of railway infrastructure

Safety/Interoperability (public law)

- carriage of dangerous goods by rail
- technical prescriptions for railway material
- technical admission of railway material



Scope of application of COTIF and its Appendices


(as at 1.2.2010)






OTIF - OSJD Member States

2 members of the EEA

Liechtenstein, Norway

- 1 party to bilateral agreements with EU
- 3 candidates for accession to EU

Croatia, The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Turkey

3 potential candidates for accession to EU

Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Serbia

Total: 34 ≈ ¾ of OTIF MS



Compatibility COTIF 1999 – EU law

- 3.6.1999 COTIF 1999 adopted, compatible with the law of the EU at that time
- subsequent entry into force of new law of the EU covering partly areas regulated in COTIF – Annexes:
 - 15 March 2001: Directive 2001/14/EC on the allocation of railway infrastructure capacity and the levying of charges for the use of railway infrastructure and safety certification
 - 20 April 2001: Directive 2001/16/EC on the interoperability of the trans-European conventional rail system
 - 30 April 2004: Directive 2004/51/EC amending Council Directive 91/440/EEC on the development of the Community's railways
 - 21 June 2004: Directive 2004/49/EC on safety on the Community's railways (Railway Safety Directive)
 - 3 December 2009: entry into force of Regulation (EC) No 1371/2007 on rail passengers' rights and obligations
- 1.7.2006 entry into force of COTIF 1999, compatibility with the then law of the EU disputed



Compatibility COTIF 1999 – EU law

- after 2006: Reservations by 24 OTIF MS regarding non-application of Appendices CUI, APTU and ATMF
- 23 25 June 2009 meeting of OTIF's Revision
 Committee to adapt these appendices in order to achieve full compatibility of COTIF with EU law
- 1.12.2010 revision will take effect

Effects on facilitation

- withdrawal of reservations
- accession of EU to COTIF
- legal and technical interoperability between EU and non-EU MS of OTIF
- securing interests of Non-EU MS by
 - participation in development of TSI
 - dedicated meetings of non-EU MS



Cooperation with OSJD/UNECE

- 1st session of informal Group of Experts on Unified Railway Law to be held in Geneva 26.03.2010
- Annex 9 to the International Convention on the Harmonization of Frontier Controls of Goods, 1982 ("Harmonization Convention") to be adopted in Geneva on 27.05.2010
