Croatia - transit country

- The New International and Temporary Protection Act
- UAMs accommodated in the **asylum reception centre for vulnerable groups** or the socio-pedagogical facilities of the Social Welfare authorities
- High risk of disappearances
- On the move risk of irregularity
- Lack of awareness on TiP
- Dependency on adults who might be involved in trafficking



CRC Main Activities – asylum reception centres

- Psychosocial support, social services
- Support to UAMs tailored to their needs and resources
- Empowerment: access to education and skills building
- Continuing care and follow up
- National Referral Mechanism



Unaccompanied minors

- Prevention and monitoring of safeguards for human trafficking and SGBV
- Trafficking prevention activities in the reception centres: information on TiP provided in appropriate way - individual talks, workshops, movies followed by discussion
- Identification: cooperation and referral in accordance with the National Referral Mechanism

Unaccompanied minors

- Raising awareness and enhancing cooperation amongst institutions and CSO: establishment of "Coordination for UAMs"
- Training of special guardians UNHCR, Ministry of Social Policy and Youth
