## INTRODUCTION

- LOOKING BACK 10 YEARS AGO
  - o HSPSC LAUNCHED THE **Project to Combat Human Trafficking in Mongolia** with the support of the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (2008-2012)
- RESULTS WE SEE TODAY
  - o Stand-alone Law on HT
  - o 2 Shelters for VOT
  - o TEACHING HT IN SCHOOLS
  - o 50% increased awareness of the public

- 8 RELEVANT EXISTING LEGISLATION AMENDED
- TRAININGS FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT
- AWARENESS-RAISING CAMPAIGNS

- Mongolia Source and Destination Country for Men, women and Children for Forced Labour and Sex Trafficking
- Mongolia classified as Tier 2 Country (U.S. TIP Report 2017)

## COOPERATION AT THE NATIONAL LEVEL

- Raise awareness of the Government on HT High Priority!
  - Cooperation with the National Human Rights Commission of Mongolia –
     Drafting of the 2008 National Human Rights Report to focus on HT
- COOPERATION WITH MINISTRY OF JUSTICE, POLICE DEPARTMENT, CIA, CSOS
  - O DRAFTING THE 1ST STAND-ALONE LAW ON HT
- COOPERATION WITH POLICE DEPARTMENT
  - ESTABLISHMENT OF SPECIAL UNITS TO FIGHT HT
- SUB-COUNCIL AT THE MINISTRY OF JUSTICE TO ERADICATE HT (HSPSC IS A MEMBER)
- COOPERATION WITH MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT

## PARTNERSHIP WITH NGOS

- Today, ~ 20 NGOs working on HT
- Anti-Trafficking Network of NGOs established by HSPSC (2014)
  - o 19 members (INCL. Caritas Czech)
  - o Established Rules & Regulations; digital quarterly News Releases
  - o Cooperation is more Concerted & Coordinated
  - Carries more weight for Joint Action
  - TURNING THE NETWORK INTO AN EFFICIENT INSTRUMENT IS CHALLENGING
    - > LACK OF RESOURCES
    - > Lack of qualified personnel
- NGO "CULTURE" IN MONGOLIA HAS TAKEN DEEP ROOT GROWING INFLUENCE
- HOWEVER, MANY FACE CHALLENGES; ARE SHORT-LIVED

## REGIONAL, INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

- Some members of Anti-Trafficking Network Joined GAATW
- HSPSC is a MEMBER OF APRRN
- REGIONAL MEMBERSHIP PROVIDES OPPORTUNITIES
  - O TO BE INFORMED OF HT SITUATION GLOBALLY
  - o learn from & gain outside experience
- WITH HSPSC INITIATIVE
  - O MONGOLIAN GOVERNMENT CONCLUDED AN AGREEMENT WITH MACAO ON HT
  - o MOU BETWEEN MONGOLIAN BORDER POLICE DEPT. & CHINESE COUNTERPART
- More active support from Foreign Ministry needed

## CONCLUSION

- A DECADE HAS PASSED IN ANTI-TRAFFICKING EFFORTS IN MONGOLIA.
- CSOs do most of the work.
- HT IS NOT A PRIORITY FOR THE GOVERNMENT
  - > LACK OF FUNDING AND SUPPORT
- THIS SITUATION WILL LIKELY CONTINUE IN THE YEARS TO COME.
  - > DIFFICULT ECONOMIC SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY
- CSOs need to continue their work to fight HT
- Domestic violence in the social agenda of the Government

## CONCLUSION

- NEEDS FOR NGO PARTNERSHIP -
  - SET UP REFERRAL SYSTEM FOR VOTS
    - > INCLUDE GOVERNMENTAL INSTITUTIONS
    - > Increase cooperation & efficiency bet. NGOs & Government
- COLLABORATION WITH DONORS
  - O THEIR ROLE IS DIMINISHING
  - O SOME DISAPPEARED
  - O OTHERS INVOLVED IN SMALL-SCALE PROJECTS
- SPECIAL MENTION COOPERATION WITH SWEDEN
  - O ASSISTING VOTS WITH TALITA ASIA NGO
  - O AID EFFECTIVENESS THRU LONG-TERM ASSISTANCE

## CONCLUSION

• MOST IMPORTANT POINTS FOR THE AID TO BE EFFECTIVE:

FIRST - LONG-TERM PROJECTS

<u>SECOND</u> – **CONTINUOUS**, SIGNIFICANT FUNDING

THIRD - FOCUSING ON QUALITY, THAN QUANTITY, FOR EFFICIENCY AND IMPACT
