**Responding to environmental challenges with a view to promoting
co-operation and security in the OSCE area**

Opening session

Mr. Chairperson,

First of all, allow me to thank the Swiss Chairmanship of the OSCE, the Secretary General, Mr. Lamberto Zannier, the Co-ordinator of OSCE Economic and Environmental Activities, Mr. Halil Yurdakul Yigitgüden, and the distinguished speakers for their thorough presentations, which set the necessary tone for the work of this preparatory meeting.

The annual Economic and Environmental Forum is a key event within the second basket of the OSCE and represents an important and necessary format for developing dialogue and co-operation between participating States on the most pressing issues of economic and environmental security.
