Ambassador Jan Braathu

Jan Braathu (Norway) is the sixth OSCE Representative on Freedom of the Media, appointed in December 2024. Prior to his appointment, Braathu served as Head of the OSCE Mission to Serbia from January 2021 to December 2024 and Head of the OSCE Mission in Kosovo from October 2016 until December 2020. Previously, he was Norway's Ambassador to Kosovo and Albania, and Ambassador to Bosnia and Herzegovina. His other assignments have included serving as Deputy Director General and Head of the Division for Western Balkan Affairs. Braathu also served in the Norwegian Foreign Ministry's OSCE Chairpersonship-in-Office Section from 1998 to 2000. He held the role of First Secretary and Acting Counsellor for Economic Affairs at the Royal Norwegian Embassy to the Court of St. James's from 1993 to 1996. He was also First Secretary at the Royal Norwegian Embassies in Kuwait and Saudi Arabia from 1990 to 1993.



Philippe Tremblay

Philippe Tremblay joined as Director of the Office of the OSCE Representative on Freedom of the Media after five years as Head of External Co-operation in the Office of the OSCE Secretary General. Prior to joining the OSCE in late 2018, he was a Canadian diplomat for 20 years, working abroad as Deputy Head of Mission and Acting Ambassador at the Embassy of Canada to Turkey, Georgia, Azerbaijan and Turkmenistan, together with prior postings to Tokyo and New York. At Global Affairs Canada in Ottawa, he was Departmental Chief of Staff to two Foreign Affairs Ministers, Director of Planning in other government departments and fulfilled additional roles in the Protocol, Arms

Control/Disarmament and Policy Planning Bureaus. Earlier in his career, he contributed to the mission of other international organizations, including UNODC, the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty Review Conference, the Atlantic Treaty Association and multiple G7 and G20 Summits and Ministerial meetings. Philippe was the 2015-16 Canada Fellow at Harvard's Weatherhead Center for International Affairs and holds degrees from Université Paris-1 PanthéonSorbonne, the Diplomatic Academy of Vienna and the Université de Montréal.



Ambassador Terhi Hakala

Ambassador Terhi Hakala is a Finnish diplomat who, prior to her current appointment, served as the EU Special Representative for Central Asia. Among her bilateral Ambassador postings to the South Caucasus, Geneva, and India, she has worked as a Director-General for Russia, Eastern Europe, and Central Asia, the Head of the OSCE Mission to Georgia, and Ambassador for Countering Hybrid Threats.




Begaim Usenova

With over a decade of experience, she has conducted research, legal analysis, and provided policy recommendations on the development of independent journalism and media literacy in Kyrgyzstan. A strong advocate for public interest journalism, Begaim has focused particularly on the impact of online harassment of journalists, exploring how such threats undermine press freedom and the safety of media professionals, especially women journalists. Through collaboration with international organizations, state institutions, and civil society, she plays an active role in shaping media policy to strengthen press freedom amid growing challenges and threats to independent journalism.

She also holds coordination roles in major EU-wide projects, including the European Digital Media Observatory and the Media Pluralism Monitor.

Under his leadership, both organizations play a key role in advancing responsible AI governance, digital rights, and technology policy across the Central Asia region. He is also a member of the working groups of the Parliament of the Republic of Kazakhstan on the development of the Law on Artificial Intelligence and the Digital Code, contributing to the creation of a comprehensive national legal framework for emerging technologies.

Ruslan's professional interests include digital governance, data protection, innovation policy, and the ethical use of technology. He regularly contributes to international forums, sharing regional perspectives on digital transformation and AI governance.

Author and co-author of guides: "Hate speech in Kazakhstan: statistics, judicial practice, recommendations", "Legal framework and practice of blocking Internet content in the Republic of Kazakhstan", "Defamation and Insult Laws in the OSCE Region: A Comparative Study" (section on Kazakhstan).



Ilkhom Khamidov

Ilkhom Khamidov graduated from the University of World Economy and Diplomacy in Tashkent (2033 – bachelor's degree, 2012 – master's degree). Since 2003, he has been carrying out his professional activities in the field of intellectual property law. Participated in the development of a new version of the Law of the Republic of Uzbekistan "On Copyright and Related Rights" (adopted in 2006), as well as other draft laws, including in the field of media. He started his activity in the Uzbek Republican Copyright Agency (2003-2005), then continued in a large media holding. In 2006, he initiated the creation of the first organization for the collective management of the property rights of authors, performers and other right holders (public association "The Guild of Authors and Performers of

Uzbekistan"), and then managed the activities of this organization. In 2015-2017 worked as a legal manager in the UNDP project for the development of e-government in the Republic of Uzbekistan.

In addition, one of the tasks is to analyze and develop draft laws, as well as media monitoring and legal expertise.

Gunjidmaa Gongor is the first Executive Director of the Media Council of Mongolia (MCM). She has an academic background in sociology, media and journalism studies, as well as extensive experience in managing civil society organizations. She holds a Master of Business Administration (MBA) and is currently pursuing a Ph.D. in social sciences at the Mongolian National University.

Until 2017, Ms. Gongor worked at the Mongolian Press Institute, where she successfully coordinated over 100 research and training projects aimed at supporting independent and professional journalism. She was one of the pioneers in establishing MCM, the first independent media self-regulatory body in Mongolia. In January 2018, she was appointed Executive Director of MCM.

Established in early 2015, MCM emerged from a successful collaboration among journalists, media houses, industry representatives, journalist associations, and professional media organizations. The Media Council of Mongolia serves as an independent regulator for printed press, broadcast media, and journalistic online platforms in the country. It upholds the highest standards of journalism by monitoring and enforcing the principles outlined in the Media Code of Ethics.

Anora Sodikova

Anora Sodikova is a journalist and media trainer from Tashkent, Uzbekistan. She is the founder and chief editor of Uzdiplomat.uz, an independent media outlet covering international affairs, governance, and social issues. Over the past 15 years, she has produced many investigative reports on corruption, women's rights, and vulnerable communities, earning recognition from organizations such as UNESCO, the EU, and the Anti-Corruption Agency of Uzbekistan.

Anora is a former Hubert H. Humphrey Fellow, having studied disinformation and media ethics at George Washington University and Indiana University in the United States. She has also taken part in various international programs, including the OSCE regional conferences, the DW Global Media Forum in Germany, and media tours to the UK, Taiwan, and other countries. Today, she continues to train journalists on media literacy, countering disinformation, and conflict-sensitive reporting across Central Asia.

Gladis Temirchieva is a journalist, editor, and media manager from Kyrgyzstan. She is the Editor-in-Chief of the analytical news platform Vesti.kg and the Chairwoman of the Media Action Platform of Kyrgyzstan, which unites leading newsrooms to promote freedom of expression and professional standards. She is the former Chairwoman and currently Member of the Supervisory Board of the Investigative Journalism Foundation of Kyrgyzstan- a member organization of the Global Investigative Journalism Network (GIJN).

Gladis has extensive experience in independent journalism, civic initiatives, and human rights advocacy. She has participated in international professional programs with JICA (Japan), Danida (Denmark), and ITEC (India). Her contributions have been recognized with Honorary Certificates from the Parliament and the Ombudsman of the Kyrgyz Republic for her work in human rights protection, as well as a Letter of Appreciation from the President of the Kyrgyz Republic for her coverage of the Kyrgyz–Tajik border conflict.

Nuriddin Karshiboev

Nuriddin Karshiboev is the Chairman of National Association of Independent Media in Tajikistan. He is a highly respected figure in the field of media development, with over 40 years of distinguished experience in mass media. He has been recognized as an Outstanding Press Worker of the Republic of Tajikistan (2009) and was honored with the Jubilee Medal commemorating the "100th Anniversary of the Tajik Press." An active participant and organizer of numerous regional and international conferences on mass media, Mr. Karshiboev brings extensive expertise in coaching, moderating, and facilitation. He is the author of more than 650 articles, essays, and scientific reports.

Beyond his media work, Mr. Karshiboev is deeply committed to human rights advocacy and media lobbying within government institutions. In March 2009, he received the Special Prize from the Media Alliance of Tajikistan for being "The Best Defender of Journalists' Rights in Tajikistan." He played a key role in developing the Ethical Norms of Journalistic Activity in Tajikistan and was instrumental in establishing the Media Council of Tajikistan, where he served as a member of Working Group from 2008 to 2009 and later as Chairman in 2015.

In 2010, he founded the Tajikistan Freedom of Expression Network (TajFEN). His contributions to press freedom were recognized internationally when Reporters Without Borders (RSF) included him among the "100 Information Heroes" in 2014. Most recently, in 2024, he was awarded the Medal for "25 Years in Defense of Freedom of Information."

In academia, Tamar Kintsurashvili serves as an associate professor at <u>Ilia State University</u>, where she teaches courses on media ethics and propaganda research methods.

Gulmira Sultanbayeva

Gulmira Sultanbayeva is a Doctor of Political Sciences, Full Professor of Political Science and a prominent scholar from Kazakhstan. She was born on January 1, 1972 in the Turkistan Region. She obtained her higher education from the S. M. Kirov Kazakh State University, graduating in 1994 with a specialty in Journalism and later completed her graduate studies at the Faculty of Journalism of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University in 1997. 


Timur Idrisov
