

Open Call for participation in the "Young Men Initiative" training for secondary schools teachers

Are you a Kosovo based secondary school teacher?

Are you looking for a first-hand experience on addressing gender-based inequalities, harmful health practices, and preventing other forms of violence amongst adolescents through an educational training?

The OSCE Mission in Kosovo, in co-operation with CARE International and local partner organizations Peer Educators Network and Sinergija, support the "Young Men Initiative" in offering a one-day training for secondary school teachers (up to 40) in Kosovo. Accredited by the Ministry of Education, Technology and Science, the "Young Men Initiative" is a region-wide programme designed to promote healthy lifestyle choices for young men and boys and to combat rigid social and gender norms.

The training is scheduled for Saturday, 23 March 2019, while the location will be announced after the group is selected.

The training is designed to strengthen the capacity of teachers of secondary schools in building more equitable attitudes and behaviours in relation to young men. The adolescence represents a pivotal lifecycle in the socialization process when attitudes and behaviours are still being developed. The training aims to prepare teachers in addressing these issues to their pupils as a regular part of the School Curriculum. Hence, empowering men and boys to recognize and successfully oppose harmful social norms will, by using their knowledge and skills, make effective decisions that contribute to healthy, non-violent resolution of relational problems and promote a society with greater equality and equity.
