Working Session 2 : Fundamental freedoms I
(30th September 2008)

EU Recommendations

Participating states should:

Ensure that media laws are in line with international standards and OSCE commitments and are implemented subsequently, strengthen their commitment to ensure freedom of opinion and expression, and especially to decriminalize libel and defamation.

Ensure that journalists in the OSCE area can work safely and without being threatened by physical violence, persecution, detention, harassment, intimidation, direct or indirect economic pressure or any other form of interference, ensure that these commitments equally apply to journalists who are also human rights defenders. Ensure that press freedom is guaranteed by an independent judiciary to which journalists can appeal in cases of alleged violations, ensure that journalists can keep their sources of information confidential by enacting appropriate legislation ('shield laws').

The OSCE representative on freedom of the media should:

Continue to assist participating states in achieving full implementation of the OSCE commitments.

Continue efforts to promote adoption of legislation which is in line with OSCE and other international standards notably in the field of defamation.
