From existing relevant legislative acts only the Criminal Code of the Republic of Moldova can be mentioned, which envisages penal sanctions for the storage, purchase, selling and use of weapons and ammunitions, including anti-personnel mines.

3. Does your country have any specific measures in place to provide assistance to victims?

No incidents of local population being injured by anti-personnel mines are registered.

4. Does your country require assistance in mine clearance, stockpile destruction, mine awareness and/or victim assistance? If so, please describe.

The Republic of Moldova does not require any assistance in mine clearance, stockpile destruction, mine awareness and/or victim assistance.

5. Does your country have the capacity to assist others in mine action? If so, please describe.

Currently, the Republic of Moldova is not able to provide any kind of assistance in mine action.
