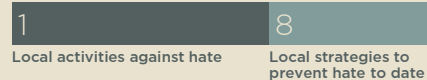

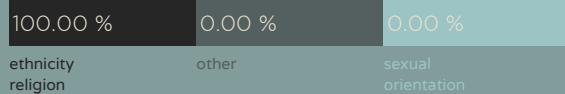

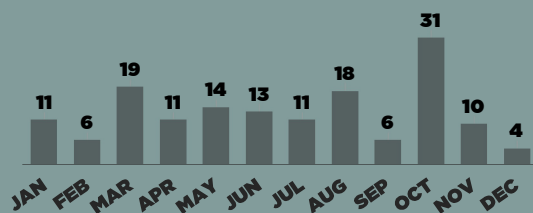

On 16 December, the OSCE Mission to Bosnia and Herzegovina organized a training for 13 young members of the Coalition against Hate from Prijedor on the subject of recognizing and preventing hate crimes and bias-motivated incidents.
