Do you want to find out more about youth policies, human rights and gender equality and also learn how to write public policies proposals? If you do, you should apply for the "School of Democracy".

This two-semester programme will include dynamic workshops, comprehensive lectures, practical training and dealing with current political issues, discussions. Members of the National Assembly, representatives of different institutions, civil society and academia in the Republic of Serbia are among the lecturers and speakers of the programme.

The programme is primarily aimed for undergraduate/postgraduate students, political party youth wings, CSO representatives and journalists.
