## Statement by Ireland Special PC 24 August 2023 The Russian Federation's ongoing aggression against Ukraine

## Mr Chair

Ireland fully aligns with the statement made by the EU and I would like to add some comments in our national capacity.

18 months ago today, a terrible decision was made. It resulted in the full-scale invasion of Ukraine by the Russian Federation.

As we know, appalling consequences ensued and continue to ensue. Death, injury, abduction, imprisonment, torture, sexual violence - pain and suffering on a colossal scale.

In the course of this terrible war against Ukraine, children, the elderly and the vulnerable have not been spared.

Widespread trauma, wanton destruction of civilian infrastructure, environmental degradation and the mining of Ukrainian land means that the horror of war will continue to be felt into the future.

Having wilfully decided to commence a full-scale war against Ukraine, the Russian Federation and only the Russian Federation is responsible for the entirety of this devastation.

On Ukraine's Independence Day, Ireland commends the bravery and resilience of the Ukrainian people and stands firmly with them.

Speaking on a visit to Ukraine in July, Ireland's Prime Minister, Taoiseach Leo Varadkar, said: 'This is the 21st century, national borders cannot be changed through violence, and democratically elected Governments should not be overthrown by foreign invasion. We have to draw a line in the sand here and stand with Ukraine for as long as it takes.'
