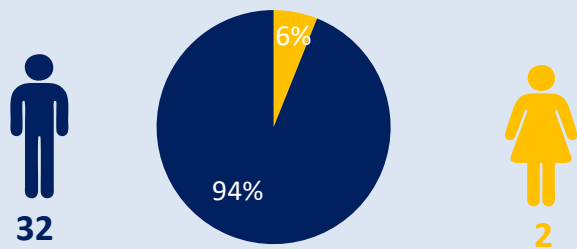


Municipal Community Safety Councils

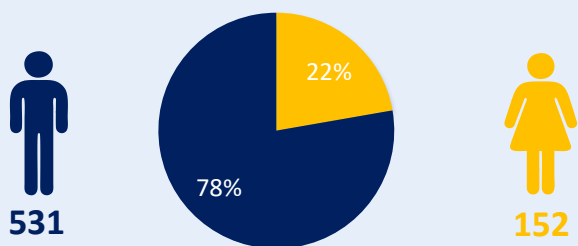
The OSCE Mission in Kosovo supports institutions and bodies responsible for addressing security concerns of communities, including the Municipal Community Safety Councils (MCSCs). The Mission conducts regular monitoring of MCSCs activities across Kosovo to enhance their performance and compliance. This information sheet outlines key indicators used to identify gaps and areas for improvement.

Established under the Ministry of Internal Affairs Administrative Instruction No. 27/2012 and the Ministry of Local Government Administrative Instruction No. 03/2012, MCSCs are created to improve community safety and security. They aim for a broad, gender-balanced, inclusive membership from all ethnic and religious communities within the municipality, contributing to communities' well-being. Between January and December 2024, there are 34 MCSCs operating across Kosovo (see the list of MCSCs on the next page).

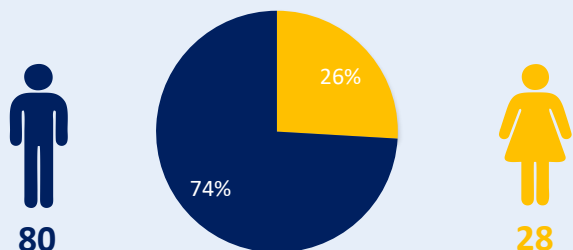
Representation of women and men as the chairperson of the MCSC



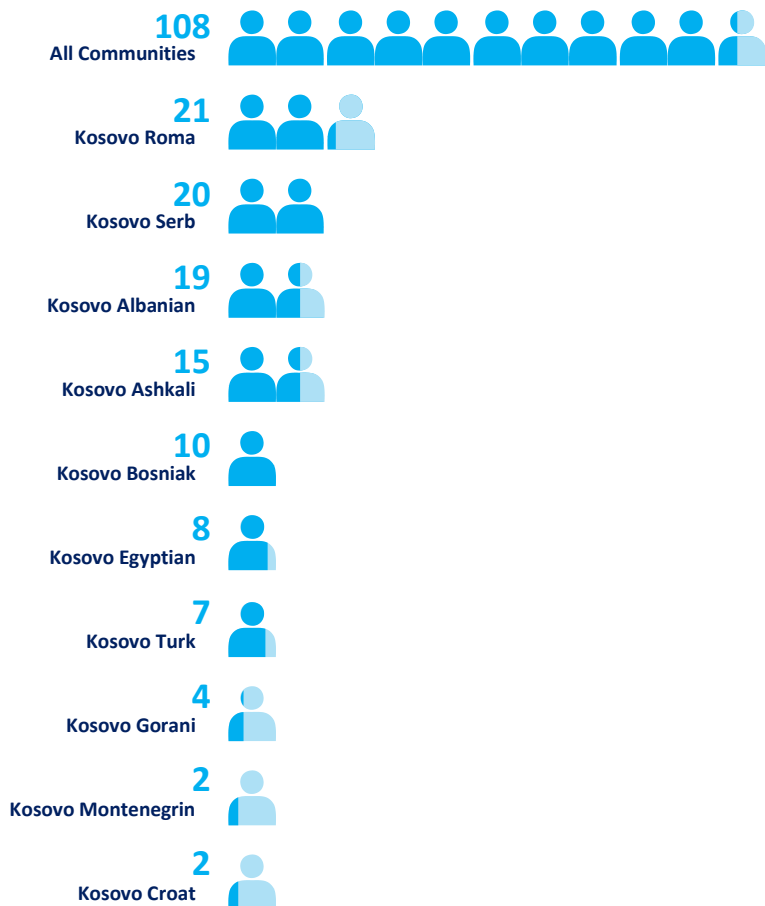
Representation of women and men in the total MCSCs membership

Number of MCSCs lacking community representation*

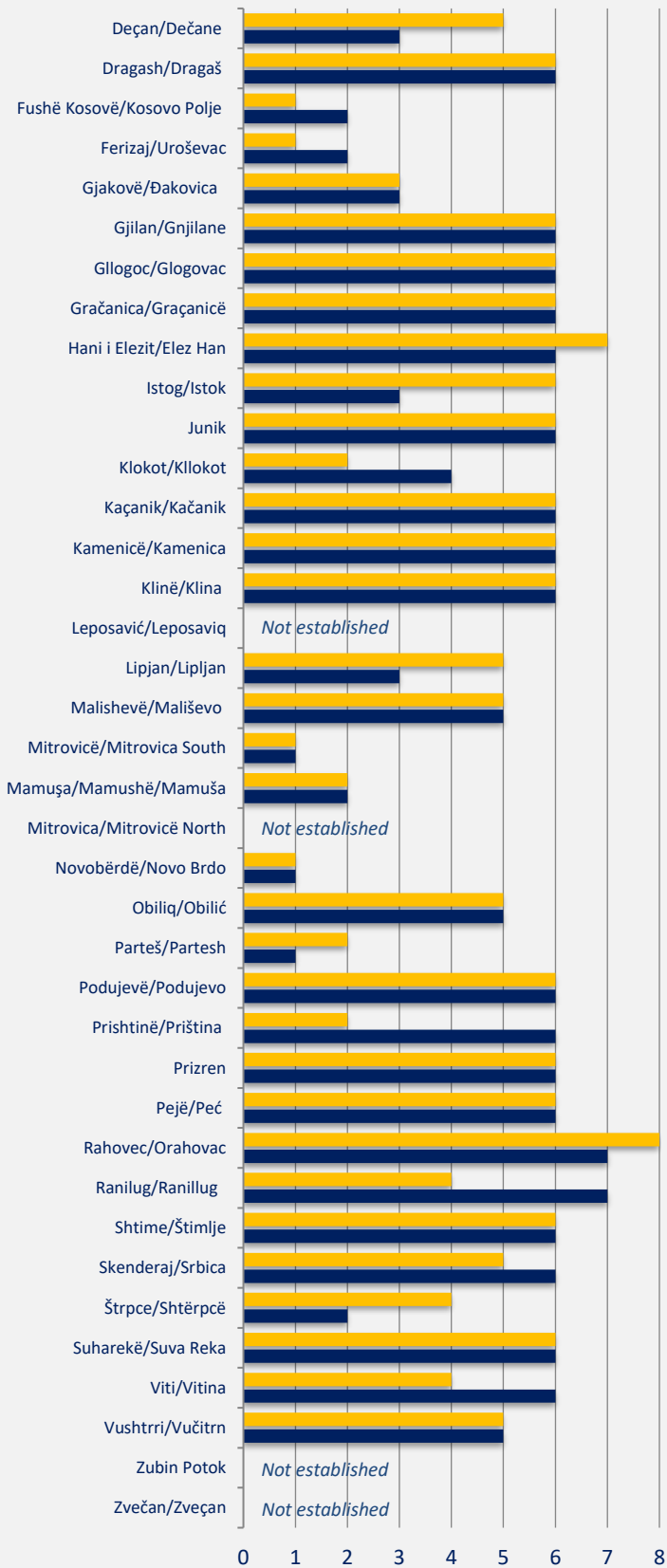

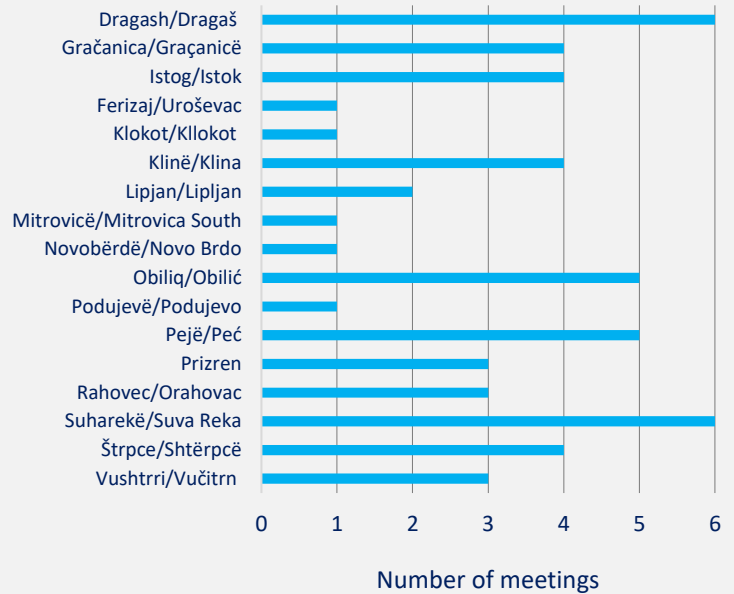

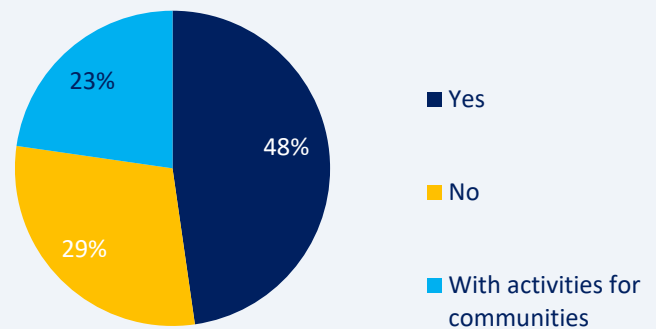
