SHARE OF MONGOLIA IN THE OSCE SCALES OF  
CONTRIBUTIONS FOR 2012**

With reference to Ministerial Council Decision No. 2/12 (MC.DEC/2/12) on the accession of Mongolia to the OSCE of 21 November 2012 and to Permanent Council Decision No. 1027 on the Scales of Contributions for 2012 of 22 December 2011, the Permanent Council approves the share of Mongolia in the OSCE Scales of Contributions to be applied from 21 November 2012 to 31 December 2012 as follows:

**INTERPRETATIVE STATEMENT UNDER  
PARAGRAPH IV.1(A)6 OF THE RULES OF PROCEDURE  
OF THE ORGANIZATION FOR SECURITY AND  
CO-OPERATION IN EUROPE**

By the delegation of France:

“Mr. Chairperson,

I should like to make the following interpretative statement.

France was able to join the consensus on this decision establishing the total amount of contributions by Mongolia to the Organization’s Unified Budget and to the budgets of the field missions, in the light of the elements contained in the Secretariat’s report to the chairmanship of the Advisory Committee on Management and Finance. The report was sent to all the participating States on 27 November 2012.

France is of the view that scales of contributions to international organizations should be calculated on the basis of quantifiable, objective and transparent factors. It also believes that the scales of contributions should be fair, corresponding as closely as possible to participating States’ ability to pay.

It remains convinced that nothing can justify the major imbalances that persist in the scales of contributions to the OSCE by countries of equivalent national wealth.

France will continue to make efforts to ensure that the OSCE, like the majority of international organizations, finally adopts an objective, regular and transparent mechanism for reviewing the scales of contributions. This mechanism should allow for regular adjustments on the basis of economic and financial developments in the countries in the OSCE area.

I should like to request that this statement be attached to the journal of the day.”
