DECISION No. 207

The Permanent Council,

- I. Acting in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Financial Regulations (DOC.PC/1/96) as approved by the Permanent Council on 27 June 1996,
- 1. Approves the 1998 Budget contained in Annex 1; and
- 2. Approves the OSCE Post Table contained in Annex 2.
- II. Furthermore, the Permanent Council,
- 1. Decides, in accordance with OSCE Financial Regulation 2.05, to conduct a general discussion of the budget outline for 1999, including the Information Systems Strategy, not later than 30 April 1998. In the framework of this discussion, special attention will be paid to ways of improving the working methods of the informal Financial Committee and of the OSCE Secretariat regarding budgetary issues, including a programme budgeting concept;
- 2. Tasks the informal Financial Committee with discussing the issue of review of the current OSCE grading structure and with submitting the results of this discussion to the Permanent Council. In this context, the Permanent Council stresses that the upgrading of the post of the Senior Meeting Assistant does not constitute a precedent;
- 3. Decides, in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Staff Regulations (DOC.PC/2/96) as approved by the Permanent Council on 19 December 1996, that the review of the implementation of OSCE recruitment policies will be undertaken not later than 30 April 1998, and tasks the Secretary General with submitting to the Permanent Council through the informal Financial Committee a report to this effect not later than 31 March 1998;
- 4. Recalling the decision of the Heads of State or Government contained in the Budapest Document 1994 on Senior Council Meetings, decides that, in case the Chairman-in-Office decides to convene an additional meeting of the Senior Council, the Permanent Council will adopt without delay an appropriate supplementary budget;
- 5. Decides, pending a decision on the theme and modalities of the Economic Forum, to make sufficient budgetary provisions for a duration of the Economic Forum, including an implementation review, for five days;

- 6. Expressing its satisfaction with the contribution made to the Voluntary Fund for Activities related to Economic Aspects of Security, encourages participating States, partners for co-operation, as well as international organizations, to contribute to this Fund; furthermore, on the basis of a report prepared by the Secretary General, to conduct general discussions on the financing of the OSCE Economic and Environmental Dimension, including the financing of relevant seminars;
- 7. Noting that provision is included for the establishment of the posts of Human Dimension Expert and Economic/Environmental Expert in the OSCE Liaison Office in Central Asia as of 1 July 1998, invites secondments to fill these positions prior to 1 July, on the basis of tasks to be discussed beforehand in the Permanent Council;
- 8. Expressing its satisfaction with the fact that, thanks to voluntary financial contributions, it was possible to reduce the assessed 1998 budget of the Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights by ATS 1,164,000, stipulates that the 1999 budgetary submission for the ODIHR will be based on the 1998 submission contained in the unified budget proposal of the Secretary General (PC.IFC/6/97 Restr.), taking into account any change in the scope of the ODIHR's activities;
- 9. Noting the importance of ensuring that the OSCE missions and field operations have adequate resources to fulfil their designated tasks, and realizing that they may face unexpected expenses, expresses its intention to continue to consider expeditiously and favourably requests by the OSCE Secretariat for transfers of funds between OSCE missions and field operations, in accordance with relevant provisions of the OSCE Financial Regulations;
- 10. In connection with the adoption of the budget of the OSCE Mission to Croatia, tasks the Secretary General with continuing, as a matter of priority, negotiations with Croatian authorities on the issue of duties and taxation of local staff salaries, and with reporting to the PC on the progress achieved not later than 31 January 1998; and further decides that the new scale of distribution of costs for large OSCE missions and projects, if available in 1998, will be applicable to the 1998 budget of the OSCE Mission to Croatia, provided that all conditions for its applicability to this Mission have been fulfilled;
- 11. Pending the adoption of the 1998 budget for OSCE tasks in Bosnia and Herzegovina, which will take place not later than 31 January 1998, authorizes the Secretary General to incur obligations of up to ATS 62,218,948.5 in respect of the fulfilment of these tasks, and to bill participating States for amounts up to the level of 50 per cent of the above-mentioned amount; and further decides that the new scale of distribution of costs for large OSCE missions and projects, if available in 1998, will be applicable to the 1998 budget of the OSCE Mission to Bosnia and Herzegovina, provided that all conditions for its applicability to this Mission have been fulfilled.

Chairman's Statement

In the transitional phase towards implementation of the new scale for larger missions and projects, participating States will be billed 25 per cent of either scale for the Missions to Bosnia and Herzegovina and to Croatia. There will be freedom of choice. The Secretary General foresees a more restricted cash flow. Managing will be more cumbersome. There will be more administrative strain on the Secretariat and on the Missions.

Even if internal procedures cannot be accomplished on time, this arrangement is nevertheless necessary to allow for implementation of this major breakthrough in OSCE financing.

When this implementation period is over and the new scale adopted, delegations will be billed for the residual amount for the Missions to Bosnia and Herzegovina and to Croatia according to the new scale.

Chairman's Statement

The decision just adopted indicates that the OSCE Representative on Freedom of the Media will be appointed at a particular grading level. It is the view of the Chairmanship that this choice of grade for the OSCE Representative on Freedom of the Media calls into question the overall classification of Heads of OSCE institutions. It is the view of the chairmanship that the Director of ODIHR should be on a par with other functions of that type. Due to time pressure, it has not been possible to address this question in detail in the framework of the 1998 budget discussion. It is the understanding of the Chairmanship that this matter will be returned to in the course of 1998.

<u>Interpretative statement under paragraph 79 (Chapter 6) of</u> the Final Recommendations of the Helsinki Consultations

By the delegation of Turkey:

"We support both the appointment of and the level allocated to Mr. Duve as the future OSCE Representative on Freedom of the Media. He is an eminent person. As delegations are aware, we also wanted to bring the Director of ODIHR to the same level. Our position is, I believe, based on a logical reason. You might recall that questions related to the media were a part of ODIHR's portfolio. Now they have been separated. Yet ODIHR as a whole remains a whole. Therefore, it would have been logical to elevate the Director's status to the level of the newly created Representative on Freedom of the Media.

My delegation agrees with the conclusion of the Chairman and will pursue the implementation of the Chairman's conclusion in the coming year.

Mr. Chairman, I would kindly ask you to append this statement to the journal of the day."

The delegation of the United States of America associated itself with the above statement.
