Short biography

Dr. Andrei Zagorski is currently leading Researcher at the Center for War and Peace Studies, and Professor at the Moscow State Institute of International Relations (MGIMO-University). Dr. Zagorski is an expert on Russian foreign and security policy, European security, post Soviet studies and arms control. In 1992 -1999, he served as Vice Rector of the MGIMO-University in charge of research and external cooperation. In 2000 and 2001 he worked in Prague for the EastWest Institute as Senior Vice-President, Director of the International Security Program, and as Project Director. He also has taught at the Geneva Center for Security Policy (2002), and has been Deputy Director of the Institute for applied International Research in Moscow (2002 – 2003). In 1987 – 1991, Dr. Zagorski has served as advisor to the Soviet delegations at a series of the CSCE meetings. As a founding member, he has chaired the Russian association for Nonproliferation in 1992 through 1995. He is Vice-President of the Russian association for Euro-Atlantic cooperation, member of the International Advisory Board of the Geneva Center for Democratic Control of Armed Forces, and of the editorial boards the OSCE Yearbook (Hamburg), Security and Human Rights (former Helsinki Monitor, the Hague), and Perspectives (Prague). Dr. Zagorski has authored over 2000 publications in his areas of expertise.
