On May 16, 2015 military clashes with GRU Spetsnaz Units in the area of Luhansk thermal station near the settlement of Schastya

On May 17, 2015 Main Investigation Department of the SSU launched criminal proceeding N22015000000000142 under Article 258-3 of the Criminal Code of Ukraine

On May 18, 2015 detained soldiers of Russia's GRU were accommodated in the military hospital of Ministry of Defense of Ukraine. In order to save the damaged limbs, Ukrainian doctors conducted a series of complex operations. Health status of the detainees is currently satisfactory.



## Established Facts of last rotation of battalion group of 3rd Separate Brigade of Spetsnaz in Ukraine

- On March 19, 2015 the battalion group arrived at the airport Millyerovo in Rostov region, deployment period until June 2015.
- On March 20 units started to move to the territory of Ukraine from the field camp in Dolotynka town of Millyerovskyi district.
- On May 17, Battalion units in cities Luhansk and Bryanka were alarmed and immediately redeployed to the territory of Russian Federation.
- On May 18, military transport aircraft of the Armed Forces "IL-76" landed at the airfield
   "Millyerovo" and urgently evacuated to the unit to Samara city





# Clash in the area of Herasymivka

- Sniper and tactical support group in camouflage suits "Lyeshyy" were detected at 200 meter distance from the state border
- Russian commandos used hand grenades and conducted small arm firing of border patrol unit
- At about 19.50 under the cover of small arms the subversive group redeployed to the territory of Russian Federation

### The Clash in the Area of Luhansk Thermal Station

On May 16, 2015 at 14:20 ATO forces engaged in a fight with recon 3rd GRU Separ; Brigade of Spetsnaz (up to 15 people) Russia's Losses GRU officer killed GRU officers captured, Special Sniper Rifle Vintorez seized GRU officers wounded ATO Forces' Losses Junior Sergeant of 92nd Mechanized Brigade Pugachov V. killed 3 servicemen wounded

In order to prevent the evacuation of captured soldier by ATO forces, the Russian military intelligence opened mortar and grenade fire, inter alia, at its own positions, resulting in killing Sergeant Anton Kazakevych ("Antyp"), commander of 2<sup>nd</sup> company of "LNR's" international brigade.





# GRU servicemen are paid cash bonuses for fighting in eastern Ukraine

Financial rewards became the decisive motive for Aleksandrov and Erofeyev to participate in fighting in eastern Ukraine, as it provided an opportunity to pay back military mortgage and a loan for brand new "Skoda" car



Facts opened during investigations on involvement the Russian military in the fighting in eastern Ukraine show that the leadership of the Russian Armed Forces warns the Russian military on their possible status in case of falling into captivity. In case with captain Yevgeniy Yerofeyev and sergeant Alexandr Alexandrov, after their arrest they were released retroactively from the Armed Forces of Russia.

On 22 January 2016 the lawyers of captain Yerofeyev and sergeant Alexandrov showed to the court in Kiev extracts from the orders of military units about dismissing them from the Armed Forces of Russia, as well as documents confirming their affiliation to the so-called "People's militia of the LPR".

At the same time, advocates have presented documents proving the alleged service of the Russians in the so-called "Luhansk people's militia". Actually, the lawyers argue in court that their clients at the time of arrest are not operated by the Russian military personnel.

As for captain Yevgeniy Yerofeyev, according to the document provided by lawyers, he was released from the Russian military service in reserve on his own will. The reason - "due to organizational and staffing measures".







According to the documents, sergeant Aleksandr Aleksandrov was allegedly dismissed from the military service in reserve at the request of the commander of the military unit of 2 December 2014. The reason for leaving - "In connection with the improper execution by serviceman of contract."
