

### Highlighted

In June, representatives from the City of Sarajevo actively participated in a workshop on crisis management and the creation of a response protocol for bias-related incidents and hate crimes, demonstrating their commitment to condemning acts driven by prejudice, and stereotypes. After adopting the Protocol and a Crisis Management Plan, city officials will receive guidance regarding making informed decisions before utilizing the Protocol.
