

Thank you Mr. Moderator

I would like to take your attention to a very important issue which needs a quick action.

My speech will be addressed to the official delegation of the republic of Poland.

A story is about asylum seeker who faces extradition from Poland to Tajikistan.

Mr. Mustafo Hayotov is an activist of the political movement "Group 24". In July 2016, after harassment and a sense of danger to his life in Russia, he decided to escape to Europe. In August 2016 he arrived Poland via the Ukrainian border and applied for asylum. He was participated in this meeting in September 2016. In 2017, his application was rejected twice by the Polish Immigration Service. After this, he decided to leave the country for Germany. But unfortunately he was deported to Poland according to the Dublin convention. In 23 of June 2018 when He arrived Poland he was arrested and taken to a closed camp in Grojec and he is already passing 1 year and 3 months. During this period there were many attempts by several human rights organizations to release him but unfortunately, all of this has failed. On August of this year he decided to go on hunger strike for this situation for 10 days, his health worsened and he could not walk with his feet. Despite all that there were no any results. His case has been rejected again by Department of Foreign Affairs and decided to deport him until 26 of this month. I visited him in camp yesterday, he is in a bad condition.

Ladies and Gentleman, if this young activist deported to Tajikistan, surly his life will be on danger, and he will be detaining at least for 15 years. There are many examples.

We kindly ask from the OSCE members to raise his voice and remind the Polish authorities of their obligations.

We don't have more time, its only 6 days left.

I would like to leave a copy of deportation documents to the Polish delegation and OSCE administration.
