Project news: training for election observers

From 1-3 November, the ODIHR will hold a third of its training courses for short-term election observers from OSCE states that do not regularly send observers to OSCE election missions.

The course, launched last year, is part of an ODIHR project to diversify its election observation missions, and is organized in co-operation with the OSCE Academy in Bishkek. Over 30 participants from 17 states will attend.

Recruitment for State Duma elections in the Russian Federation

Following the declared intention of the Russian Federation, in line with its OSCE commitments, to invite international observers for the 2 December 2007 elections to the State Duma of the Federal Assembly, the OSCE/ODIHR is now seeking to recruit external consultants for a potential election observation activity.
