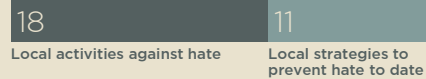

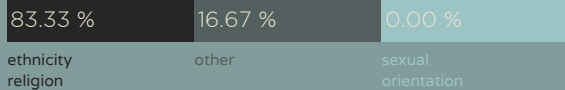

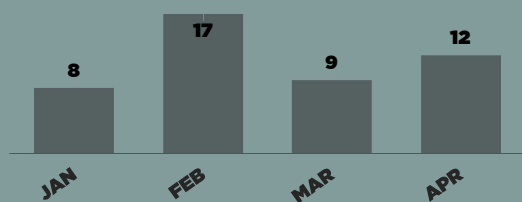

Three Coalitions against Hate were established in April 2017, in Gornji Vakuf/Uskoplje, Tuzla and Zenica, increasing the total number of Coalitions in BiH to 29.
