Intervention World Union of Jewish Students during session 1:

Honored delegates, Mr. Chairman,

Jewish students around the world are encountering anti-Semitism. They have to deal with intolerance and often anti-Semitism in the expressions of so called anti-Israel arguments. Student newspapers, websites and other forms of media often have anti-Semitic articles and other features in them.
