1. The conference will be held at:

Brussels Expo ("Heysel") Auditorium 2000 and Hall 10 Place de la Belgique 1020 Brussels www.brusselsexpo.be

- 2. The conference will be entirely open to the media. Access to the conference premises for media representatives will be by special press card, obtainable only by prior accreditation. Please note that media representatives already accredited to the Belgian foreign and interior ministries (FPS) must also apply for special accreditation.
- 3. The accreditation process will take place between August 16th and September 10th, 2004. It is recommended that media representatives apply as early as possible. Accreditation forms and other information on technical questions are available at http://www.osce.org/documents/cio/2004/07/3075 en.pdf.
- 4. The special press cards can be collected from the Press desk at the Conference centre from 8.00 till 18.00 on Monday 13 September and from 8.00 till 15.00 on Tuesday 14 September. A pre-registration desk will be opened on Sunday 12 September from 14.00 till 18.00 at the main entrance of the Public Federal Service Foreign Affairs (Ministry) located 15 rue des Petits Carmes/Karmelietenstraat, 1000 Brussels subway station "Porte de Namur", map available on www.diplomatie.be). A valid press card and an identification document carrying a passport photograph will be requested at collection.
- 5. During the conference, the press working area will offer workspaces with ISDN connections, the use of which is free of charge. As PCs will not be provided, journalists should bring their own laptops and mobile phones to the press working area.
- 6. Events that are not accessible directly for reasons of space will be broadcast into the press centre via closed circuit TV. Plenary sessions of the conference will be simultaneously translated between the six official OSCE languages (English, French, German, Italian, Russian, and Spanish).

1. The OSCE Conference on Tolerance and the Fight against racism, xenophobia and discrimination will be held on 13 and 14 September 2004. It is hosted by the Belgian Government at the Brussels Expo ("Heysel"), Auditorium 2000 and Hall 10 (Place de la Belgique, 1020 Brussels, www.brusselsexpo.be)

2. Press programme:

a) General

The entire conference will be open to the press. 6. Events that are not accessible directly for reasons of space will be broadcast into the press centre via closed circuit TV. All participants should take into account the fact that high-level security measures will be operating throughout the conference. Changes to the programme may occur at short notice.

b) Special press events

On the first morning, Monday 13 September, a photo opportunity will be offered during the arrival of the VIPs. This will include a handshake ceremony with the opening speakers, Belgian Prime Minister Guy Verhofstadt, HRH Prince Filip of Belgium, Belgian Foreign Minister Karel De Gucht, and the OSCE Chairman-in-Office, Bulgarian Foreign Minister Solomon Passy.

Interested photographers and camera-men should be at the press centre at 8.15 at the latest to pass registration and security procedures in due time to participate in the photo opportunity.

A closing press conference with Belgian Foreign Minister Karel De Gucht and Bulgarian Foreign Minister Solomon Passy will be held at 13.30 on Tuesday 14 September, in the press centre.

c) Plenary area

The plenary sessions will be broadcast on a video screen in the press centre, and interpreted into all six OSCE working languages (German, English, French, Spanish, Italian, Russian). Head phones and audio recording facilities will be provided in the press centre.

Access for photo journalists and cameramen to some events and locations may be subject to pooling. Depending on numbers, pooling regulations may also apply to photo sessions for potential bilateral talks on the fringes of the conference.

d) Side events

Journalists are generally invited to report on the side events, **space permitting**. However, photo-journalists and cameras are not allowed at these events, unless specifically invited.
