


- Strategically located & a Transport corridor


A Sea of Opportunities and Challenges


A sea of challenges too!

 - pollution and oil transport risks;Unsustainable coastal development


Seals are disappearing too!

A Sea of Opportunities and Challenges

And there is oil,

- KZ can produce 1.3 Million a day by 2009 and twice by 2015 . This a huge increment in the tight global oil market
- · Considerable gas reserves in TK and AZ

A Sea of Opportunities and Challenges

- A major challenge is access to Market: competing routes some through the Sea
- Oil spill from aging vessels: disaster waiting to happen
- Pipelines across the Sea? Seismic active

A Sea of Opportunities and Challenges

Pollution

- Hotspots of industrial pollution : DDT is still noted in tests
- Overall not a hugely polluted Sea but hotspopts some very hot; still some hope!
- Algae blooms point to change in chain food mechanism

A Sea of Opportunities and Challenges Coastal Development and WLF

- Fast and unsustainable development
- Sea Level fluctuations- 1.m meter in some 20 years- pose a serious threat that could turn into a major costly issue due to climate change

A Sea of Opportunities and Challenges

What have we tried to do

- CEP is an inter- governmental regional environmental programme assisted by GEF and EU and in operation since 1998.
- CEP is being aligned with the The Tehran Convention Secretariat fully ratified in 2006
- GEF new support to CEP focusing on bioresources management and regional governance

A Sea of Opportunities and Challenges

CEP is essentially an engine for

- regional environmental dialogue;
- Diagnostic work and strategy& policy development
- resource mobilization

A Sea of Opportunities and Challenges

- the centre piece for dialogue is the Tehran Convention with the 1st Conference of Parties (COPI) held in Baku in May 2007 with COPII planned for Tehran later this year.
- Four protocols of Biodiversity Protection, EIA in Transboundary Context, Land Based Sources of Pollution and Oil Pollution Incidents from Vessels slated for approval by COPII with OPI having stated national approval processes.

A Sea of Opportunities and Challenges

- On the diagnostic front we have done massive researches and studies culminating in strategies, plans, road maps etc.
- Good progress but a a lot to do yet.

A Sea of Opportunities and Challenges

- On the Resource mobilization front we have had some success but need to do more.
- The region investment in environment of the Caspian has been considerable in the last few years but investment still not a high priority
