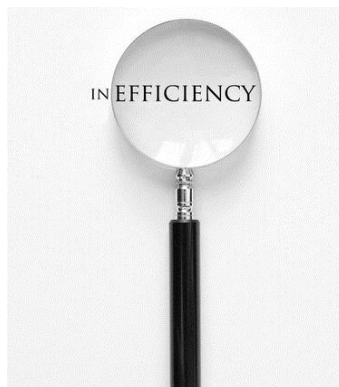

Deaths registered weekly in England and Wales: provisional news ending in May 2020
The number of death registrations was recorded by the Office for National Statistics (ONS) for the week ending 1 May 2020. The number of deaths registered in England and Wales in the week ending 1 May 2020 was 1,048, a decrease from 1,104 in the week ending 24 April 2020. This trend is consistent with the number of deaths registered in the week ending 27 March 2020.

Number of deaths in care homes notified to the Care Quality Commission, England
England - Released on 15 May 2020
Provisional counts of deaths in care homes notified to the Care Quality Commission (CQC) for England, by local authority. Published by the Office for National Statistics and the Care Quality Commission.

Death registrations and occurrences by local authority and health board
England - Released on 15 May 2020
Overview counts of the number of deaths registered in England and Wales, including deaths involving the coronavirus (COVID-19), by their underlying health board and local authority. The latest weekly counts are available.

Business Impact of COVID-19 Survey (BICS) results
England - Released on 15 May 2020
The highest and lowest scores for this survey are based on responses from the new category of highly business owners, which requires that respondents are their own business, and have a main trade, and business operations have been affected in the most negative period. These data relate to the period 9 March to 22 May 2020.
