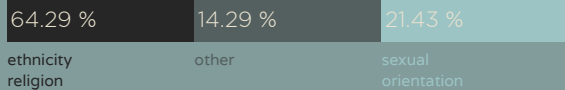

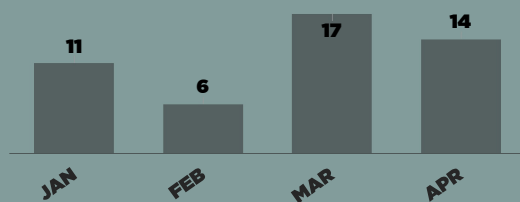

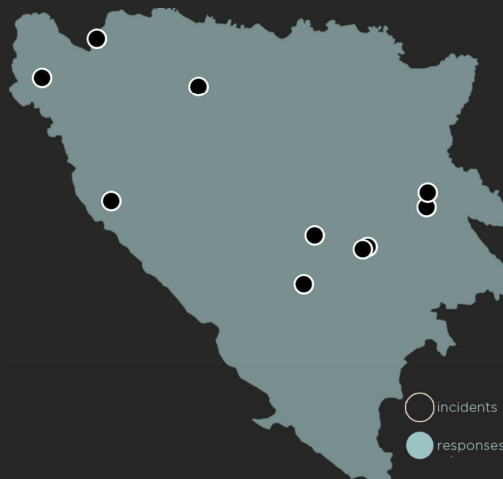

In April, the Municipality of Zavidovići and the Coalition against Hate "Kultura mira" marked International Roma Day by promoting Roma culture and tradition.
