## Key challenges

### Key challenges include:

- Insufficient safe and regular pathways resulting in children stranded and exposed to trafficking
- Lengthy and bureaucratic procedures for family reunification and asylum
- Accommodation in sub-standard centres without perspectives for future
- Limited access to services such as education and gaps in the child protection system
- Detention for migration control purposes
- Increased smuggling and exploitation along migration routes

**79**%

of globally detected trafficking victims are women and children

88%

of children arriving in Italy experienced at least one **human trafficking** or other exploitative practice


11,700

unaccompanied children are unaccounted for in Germany, Italy and Greece

at least **2,000** 

of the 12,000 fatalities in the Mediterranean Sea recorded in 2014-2017 were **children** 





# Promising practices

### Through its programmes, UNICEF:

- Provides support to Governments and other actors to strengthen child rights monitoring
- Improves protection standards in reception centres in Germany, Austria, Italy and Greece
- Strengthens child protection systems through the training of frontline workers
- Ensures access to services, including access to education
- Identifies alternatives to detention for unaccompanied and separated children

### Recommendations

### Recommendations for preventive strategies and victim support:

- Provide safe and regular pathways
- Strengthen child protection systems to prevent, identify, refer and address cases of trafficking
- Appoint guardians, provide child-friendly information and ensure access to legal aid
- End the detention of children on the move
- Prevent the <u>criminalization</u> of <u>trafficked children</u> for status offenses e.g. transactional sex, abscondment...
- Offer children access to services and durable solutions built with them
