DECISION No. 5/02 ROAD MAP OF THE FSC FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE BUCHAREST PLAN OF ACTION FOR COMBATING TERRORISM

The Forum for Security Co-operation adopts the attached Road Map of the FSC for Implementation of the Bucharest Plan of Action for Combating Terrorism and requests the Chairman of the FSC to submit it to the Permanent Council in accordance with paragraph 31 of the Bucharest Plan of Action for Combating Terrorism.

Herewith the Forum for Security Co-operation submits its "road map" to the Permanent Council fulfilling its mission according to Para. 31 of the Bucharest Plan of Action for Combating Terrorism. This "road map" includes a timetable, resource implications (at this stage: only fora involved; no personnel and financial implications yet clearly foreseeable) and indication of activities requiring further decisions.

Guidelines for the content and structure of the FSC "road map":

The Bucharest Plan of Action for Combating Terrorism has defined the guidelines for this "road map". For the purpose of consistency with that document they are repeated as follows:

- The participating States (pS) will use the FSC to strengthen their efforts in combating terrorism through full and timely implementation of all relevant measures agreed;
- The pS will enhance implementation of existing politico-military commitments and agreements, in particular the Code of Conduct on politico-military aspects of security (CoC) and the Document on Small Arms and Light Weapons (SALW);
- The FSC will examine the relevance of its other documents to combating terrorism and assess the need to develop additional norms and measures; the Security Dialogue may serve as a suitable basis for regular consultations on these issues;
- The FSC will consider ways to fully implement the Document on SALW, *inter alia*, Section V, to review information exchanged and to develop best practice guides;
- The third follow-up conference on the CoC could further enhance the application of this document.
